75 years ago
Sept. 25, 1938

Twenty-seven Hereford steers were exhibited this morning in the second annual 4-H Club cattle show held at the Producers Livestock Cooperative stockyards at the south end of the city. Twenty-two Auglaize and Allen county boys, members of 4-H beef clubs, entered the show and sale. Prof. Larry Bair of the Ohio State Agricultural College was the judge. Robert Flynn, New Hampshire, won the show with a steer that weighed 1,030 pounds that he sold at \$12.25 per hundredweight. Warren Armstrong of St. Marys had the reserve champion, weighing 990 pounds and he sold at \$11.75 per hundredweight. The heaviest steer was shown by James Stewart of Allen County. It weighed 1,220 pounds. The cattle were sold to the Eastern Order Buying Co. and they were being shipped this afternoon to New York packing houses.

Lima's northwest territory celebration is estimated to have taken 50,000 persons into the downtown section Friday. Two parades were held. Alonso Copeland, 81, Santa Fe, collapsed during the morning parade. Mrs. Lydia Focht was struck by an auto and Laverle Rockhold, 16, of Spencer-ville was hit by a motorcycle.
